It is You that Hears My Prayers



With that prayer, Rajeshbhai left India in 2008 to embark on this life changing journey to America. This was a completely new land to him, and his academic and financial

Suhrad Swami folded his hands and humbly asked Swamiji, "Why did you suddenly wake up?"


Swamiji did not immediately respond. Seeing Swamiji in deep thought, Suhrad Swami again asked, "Why did you wake up? What thoughts are
